Whether you are a teacher, an accountant, a construction worker, a homemaker, or retired, you can become a Master Watershed Steward!

## Requirements

- Course participants are required to complete the certification process which has a lecture component (September – December).
- This is generally a weekly virtual Tuesday evening set of sessions with occasional Saturday outings.
- There is also capstone project component that involves a practical demonstration of acquired skills through community-based activities (January – July).
- You can maintain your Master Watershed Steward status by giving at least 20 additional volunteer hours and attending at least 8 hours of update training annually.
